The Royal Moroccan Chess Federation (FRME) organizes the 4<sup>rd</sup> TT FREM, in four 7 sections:




**E) Selfmates S#3-7** Theme: In the solution in every mate position, the white king is on the same square and the black king is on different squares. At least two full variations are required.


