For this tournament the theme was: Play of the white queen in all phases. Pin-mate. No twins, duplex, fairy pieces and conditions are allowed.

It was my honor to judge this tournament, which according to the number of problems received and their quality can be assessed as very successful. I receive 69 problems. In a large part of the problems, the two moves of the White are played by the queen.

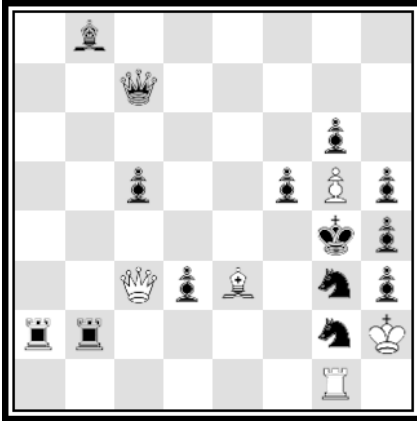
In judging, the basic criteria were: originality, complexity and economy. The judgment did not take into account non-thematic and technical problems, then symmetrical problems, as well as the problems in which the authors realized pin-mate instead bl.P uses bl.S or bl.S' or problems that have an unnatural connection, but also problems with unsynchronized play and some the first black or mate move. In Kc2/Kg5 J would replace w.Pc7 with bl.P' on c7 i d7. The problems are not compared to the published problems in the existing databases.
