




9th Composing Tourney FRME 2023 Section #2 Twomovers Final Award

I received 49 anonymous problems. When assessing, I was primarily guided by the originality and clarity of the idea. Secondly, I took into account the difficulty of the solution. Thirdly, I assessed the economy of the composition's construction. I feel that a modern twomover should have at least two thematic phases. Therefore I excluded from the award almost all single-phase compositions. Unfortunately, some compositions that I chose turned out to be anticipated ¹. Finally, I decided to distinguish the following problems.



In my opinion, the best problem in the competition, although I solved it quite quickly. It is an example of the complete cyclic Sushkov theme, achieved using three different thematic white pieces, what I found only in few examples ². The main idea is combined with the cyclic pseudo Le Grand theme. In addition to that, we have double Caprice theme. After the tries 1.Rxe4? and 1.Bb6? the refutations take the white pieces to control respectively the diagonals e2-c4 and d2-f4. After 1.Rxe4? and 1.d4! it is the white which open these lines. Moreover, the composition includes double pseudo Le Grand (AB-BA, BC-CB), Barnes and Rudenko themes. Z-22-23



The Dombrovskis theme with the double threat and a single refutation linked with the Le Grand theme is not new, but this scheme using pinning is interesting and seems to be original. The idea is complemented by the themes of Barnes and Rudenko. Z-22-22.



Again the same idea as in the previous problem: a combination of Dombrovskis and Le Grand themes. The mechanism seems to be also original, but it is a pity that the key is a capture. The idea is connected to the themes of Barnes and Rudenko. Z-31-35



The composer used a known scheme ³ of the masked half-battery in order to realize the double reversal theme combined with reciprocal captures and the Chernet theme. There is also an anti-dual theme here. The key exposes the white king to check. This problem was the most difficult for me to solve. Z-41-36



It is an interesting problem. White creates two different batteries in the third try and the solution at the same time giving the black king a flight. These two phases form the threat reversal. There is also a Urania theme in this problem. Moreover, we have Harkov 2 theme (a) with the Anti-Levman defence in the solution. Z-41-25







In addition to the Le Grand theme (AB-BA) indicated by the author, we have also cyclic pseudo Le Grand (CA-AB-BC) and pseudo Le Grand (CB-BC). Moreover, there is a Mäkihovi theme after the main thematic defence (a). It is a pity that two tries have the same refutation, Z-31-13

This problem includes Dombro-Zagoruiko theme combined with the triple Harkov 2 theme (a, b, c). In addition to that we have the Bikos theme (after 1.Qh8? and 1.Qg8!), option and threat correction. This composition would be placed higher, but unfortunately it has a serious drawback - the white rook c7 plays only in a try. Z-42-37



Here we have an option theme using the knight. All refutations, exploiting closing of lines or diagonals by the knight, become variations in the solution. The author also indicated a cycle of defences and refutations, however in the cyclic refutations theme the mates should change.





Again an option theme, this time using a bishop. Three refutations are played on the same square and become variations in the solution. The problem realizes the 11th WCCT theme. There is also a third degree black correction (1...Sge6, 1...Rge6!, 1...Rgf6!!).
