# Final Judgment of Franz Pachl

## **Section helpmate 2,5-3**

I had 26 problems in this section (10 h#2,5 and 16 h#3). In the PDB I looked for anticipations or comparable problems and came to the following result:

**B19**: There is a comparison helpmate, which has greater thematic depth with unpinning of the wR after capturing of a wS and battery construction after clearing the b-line: Ivan Soroka, The Ural's Problemist 07/2007, 2nd Prize (Kf3 Rb3 Sb4 b6 – Kf7 Qd7 Ra3 Bc5 f5 Pa4 a2 d5 e5; h#3; 2 solutions; I) 1.Bxb6; II) 1.Bxb4).

**B20**: Compared with Aleksandr Semenenko, European Problem Chess Festival 2009, 1st Special Honourable Mention (Ka2 Rd3 Sd5 f3 - Ke4 Rc1 h1 Sc2 Pa4 d6 d4 e3 g5; h#3; 3 solutions; I) 1.Kxd3; II) 1.Kxd5; III) 1.Kxf3). The B20 with identical mating positions shows nothing new.







1st Prize: B3 - Vitaly MEDINTSEV & Anatoly SKRIPNIK (RUSSIA)

- a) 1.- Bh6 2.gxh6 Qc7+ 3.Kd5 Rxe5#
- 1.- Qh5 2.Qb7 Rxe5+ 3.Kc6 Rc5#
- b) 1.- Rh5 2.gxh5 Qd3 3.Sb2 Bxe3#

This kind of unpinning with active sacrifice of a white officer captured by a bP to open a line for the unpinned wQ, I regard as original. Also the second pair with support of the pinned wQ for its mating officers is remarkable. Together this results in a rich TF helpmate with harmonious solutions and excellent analogy in both pairs.

- b) 1.c4 Sxc4+ 2.Kc5 Sa4+3.Kxc4 Bxd3#


Kniest theme with the peculiarity that the Kniest pawn first makes a move and then gets captured. This seems original, in addition change of function (wSc3/wSe3 and wRg4/wBb1) and pin mates.





Quite elaborate, but excellent Zilahi with change of block and guard on the squares c2/d2 and capturing a white piece to open the line for a white officer. Here the analogy is to the last detail.

## **1st Honourable Mention: B6 -** <u>Eugene Fomichev</u>(Russie)

- a) 1.- Rxe4 2.Qxf5 Rf6 2.Kxe4 Qxf5#
- b) 1.- Bxe4 2.Qxe5 Qf6 3.Kxe4 Qxe5#

Kniest and Umnov theme with passive and active sacrifice of two white officers in a slightly depressed position. There are many captures, but that does not hurt the problem. Amazing that no anticipation could be found.

## **2nd Honourable Mention: B24 - Michel CAILLAUD**(France)

- I) 1.Rxq5 Be6 2.Rf5 Bh4 3.Kc5 Bf2#
- II) 1.Bb8 Bxe5 2.Ba7 Bf6 3.Rfc5 Bd8#

In this charming helpmate both sides pursue the same strategy. Return with short steps after capture of a pawn to open a line.

#### **3rd Honourable Mention: B9 -** <u>christer jonsson</u>(Suede)

- I) 1.Bxh4 Rd8! (Ra5?) 2.Bxq5 Sxq5 3.Sb6 Se6#
- II) 1.Sxh3 Ra5! (Rd8?) 2.Sxg5 Bxg5 3.Kb6 Bd8#






